Pastor's Corner

The Perfect Birth Plan

"But the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary; you have found favor with God. You will conceive and give birth to a son, and you are to call him Jesus. He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of his father David, and he will reign over Jacob's descendants forever; his kingdom will never end."

Many soon-to-be parents try and nail down an exact plan for the delivery of their child. Which hospital should we go to? What should we pack in the *go bag*? Who's going to drive to and from the hospital? Who's going to watch the pets? Who's going to be in the room with mom before/during/after delivery? Even if you have all of those plans figured out ahead of time, things still may not work out exactly how you envision it.

What do you think Mary and Joseph had in their birth plan? All that Mary had to go off of was what the Angel Gabriel had told her: you will give birth to a son, and your son will actually be God's Son, the promised Messiah. She may have picked up from the Old Testament Scriptures that this Messiah would be born in Bethlehem, but regardless, I don't think many people would have included this in their birth plans:

- Instead of having the baby at home, we'll travel three days in midwinter from Nazareth to Bethlehem (probably on foot)
- We'll desperately search for a bed to sleep in (during a time when everyone will be attempting to do the same thing)
- If we can't find lodging, we have to find *some place* to lay this baby down and keep him alive, even if it means placing him in a feeding trough next to cattle.

Martin Luther comments, "Think, women, there was no one there to bathe the baby. No warm water, nor even cold. No fire, no light. The mother was herself midwife and the maid. The cold manger was the bed and the bathtub. Who showed the poor girl what to do? She had never had a baby before. I am amazed that the little one did not freeze. Do not make of Mary a stone. It must have gone straight to her heart that she was so abandoned. She was flesh and blood, and must have felt miserable – and Joseph too- that she was left in this way, all alone, with no one to help in a strange land in the middle of winter." (*Martin Luther's Christmas Book*)

We know that Mary sang with joy in the lead-up to this delivery: "My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord, and my spirit has rejoiced in God my Savior, because he has looked with favor on the humble state of his servant." But I would imagine there may also have been a brief moment of panic watching this all unfold: Is there really how the Son of God is supposed to enter into the world? Did we do something wrong?

Was this really the plan?

Yes! Every last detail happened exactly according to God's "birth plan." He worked his hand in history so that Jesus would be born in Bethlehem. The lowly circumstances around Christ's birth fit the Son of Man who came not to be served, but to serve. All of this was done according to God's plan of salvation for you and for me.

"Let us, then, meditate upon the Nativity just as we see it happening in our own babies," Luther writes, "Look upon the baby Jesus. Divinity may terrify man. Inexpressible majesty will crush him. That is why Christ took on our humanity, save for sin, that he should not terrify us but rather that with love and favor he should console and confirm."

Silent night, holy night! All is calm, all is bright round yon virgin mother and child. Holy Infant, so tender and mild, sleep in heavenly peace, sleep in heavenly peace. (CW 337:1)

SPECIAL VOTER'S CALL MTG. FOR PERMANENT DAY CARE DIRECTOR A SPECIAL

VOTER'S Call Meeting has been set for Sunday afternoon, December 10, 2023, at 1:15 p.m., and will be held at the ADAMS-FRIENDSHIP CHURCH. Shar Weibel has been Called yearly by our Church since we originally approved and called her to be our Lil' Lambs Day Care Director on December 03, 2017. Shar has been very instrumental in helping set up and organize the opening and operation of the Day Care facility since our Church opened it in February of 2018 after purchasing the "Lil Rascals" Day Care Facility which was being sold by the owner who was looking to retire.

Since Shar recently completed required courses for certification through Martin Luther College, at this Call Meeting, the Voter's Assembly will be asked to approve along with a small grade school they operate. Pastor Wilke would be asked to focus especially on outreach in addition to regular pastoral duties at Peace.

On November 19 Pastor Sellnow was called to serve as an associate pastor at Grace Lutheran Church in Glendale, AZ. Glendale is part of the Phoenix metro area which is home to about five million souls. The congregation in Glendale currently serves about 700 members and has a grade school of about 140 children. Grace has been calling for a second pastor since this summer and they are asking Pastor Sellnow to serve as the school and outreach pastor.

Please keep our congregation as well as Peace and Grace in your prayers along with our pastors. They would welcome your feedback about their calls or discussions about ministry here at St. Paul's in the coming weeks.

BUS THANK YOU At our annual congregational meeting in January, the congregation approved the selling of our school bus. Well, it finally happened. Details on the sale are noted in the next article. We had been storing the bus at the Mauston church by the garage. Twice we had to repair the bus due to vandalism. Lee Schnell did check with Brown Bus to see if we could store it on their fenced in lot, but for insurance reasons they had to decline our request.

Our Adams-Friendship congregation offered to see if their garage could be used. Lee drove the bus to Adams, but the bus was just a little too long. At that point, Lee took the bus back to his farm and stored it in one of their sheds for the winter. During the summer, it was moved outside as the shed was needed for other farming needs. Lee kept the bus plugged in to electricity so as to not wear the battery down and keep attached options in working condition. Bob Storandt contacted St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Wonewoc as well as several bus companies to see if anyone was interested in purchasing the bus. There were no takers.

Earlier this fall Randy Marschall met with Kudick Chevrolet to see about the possibility of a trade in or some other option. Kudick took the bus to their lot and added it to an online auction they were having. The result was that the company we bought the bus from (Nelson Bus Service) wanted to look it over and consider buying it. Ron Pfaff and Randy Marschall continued working with Nelson Bus Service to finalize the sale. Our church secretary Lisa Bilka handled getting the needed title replacement documents pulled together. This project got completed due to the help of many individuals. To all of you - thank you!

CHURCH OWNED SCHOOL BUS SOLD On

November 06. 2023, we accepted an offer from Nelson Bus Service to purchase our used School bus for \$10,000.00. We will be signing the title and then they will cut us a check. We originally bought the small bus from Nelson Bus Service brand new for \$57,000.00 in 2015. We mainly used it for driving our students to the Lutheran Parochial School in Wonewoc. However, it has been sitting idle for the past two years because we have not been able to find someone willing to get their CDL license which is required to drive a school bus. Requirements to get the CDL have changed, making it more difficult to obtain, therefore, making the interest in getting a bus CDL license not as appealing as previously.

The bus has been deteriorating from non-use and hard to find storage to keep it safe. The Church Council at their January 08, 2023 meeting, followed by the Voter's Assembly Annual Meeting on January 28, 2023, both passed motions to proceed with attempting to sell the bus, but give the first option to buy it to the Wonewoc Parochial School who did not want it.

Since that time many hours were spent, making contacts personally and listing the bus even online in an attempt to sell it. Finally, on October 17, we met with reps from Nelson Bus Service who were interested in it. The two reps came to Mauston, evaluated the bus, had us fix the heater and air conditioner which was not working, and then they took it to their Janesville shop to further evaluate the bus as they had concerns about many things that they knew because of code requirements that they would need to repair and update in order to prepare it for resale. They were also worried about the wiring being

chewed because of mouse droppings that were found on the bus

Preliminary thoughts and ideas have been to possibly purchase a Van to use for Church Activities which does not have requirements for a CDL needed to drive, with the requirement being that only drivers registered with our insurance company would be able to drive it. No decision has been made yet.

CHURCH COUNCIL REORGANIZATION ELECTIONS HELD FOR 2024 At their Nov. 12, 2023 monthly Council meeting, the Church Council reorganized for 2024 and elected the elder positions, which will go into effect on Jan. 01, 2024. At the October 29, 2023 Quarterly Voter's meeting, Voter's approved the nominating committee's recommendation to elect Sam Wollin from the Adams-Friendship Mission Church to serve a 2nd three year term on Council.

After the October Quarterly Voter's meeting, Todd Weibel agreed to join the Council and serve as the Secretary/Worship Elder-Mauston. At the Nov. 12 Council Meeting, Todd was appointed by the Council to serve in this position starting on Jan. 01, 2024, until he can be nominated to be elected by the Voter's assembly at the January 28, 2024 Annual Meeting. Those returning Councilmen whose terms have not yet expired, all agreed to still serve in the same positions they held in 2023, except for Dennis Montey who volunteered to move from the Secretary/Worship position to the Bldgs. & Grounds Mauston position to fill Matt Wirth's expired two terms on the Council. We would like to Thank Matt Wirth for his six (6) years of serving on Church Council.

The 2024 Joint Church Council will include the following: President = Ron Pfaff-Mauston (2nd Yr./1st Term); Co-V.P./Fellowship-Mauston = Barry Voigt (2nd Yr./1st Term); Co-V.P./Fellowship-AdamsFr. = Greg Pope (3rd Yr./2nd Term); Co-Secretary/Worship-Mauston = Todd Weibel(1stYr./1stTerm); Co-Treasurer/Stewardship/Member Involvement-Mauston = Bob Storandt (3rd Yr./1st Term); Co-Bldgs. & Grounds-Mauston = Dennis Montey (2nd Yr./1st Term); Co-Bldgs. & Grounds-Adams-Fr. = Jim Cranfield (3rd Yr./1st Term); Co-Education-Mauston = Todd Krueger (2nd Yr./1st Term); Co-Education-Adams-Fr. = Sam Wollin (1st Yr./2nd Term); & Co-Evangelism-Mauston = Art Buye (3rd Yr./1st Term).

Any newly elected or appointed Council members started attending the Council meetings in November and December 2023 to shadow and learn from the Councilmen whose positions they will assume on Jan. 01, 2024. We still have three (3) of the thirteen (13) total Joint Council Positions still open, as no one has shown interest in accepting nomination for the Adams-FriendshipCo-Treas./Stewardship/Member Involvement, Co-Secretary/Worship, and Co-Evangelism Chairman positions If someone from Adams-Friendship is interested, please contact a Pastor or President Ron Pfaff. If the Council approves your nomination, you will be

appointed to serve until the next Voter's Quarterly Mtg. where Voters can then elect you to the position.

When all positions on the Council are filled, the thirteen (13) total positions will include seven (7) from Mauston and six (6) from the Adams-Fr Mission Church.

We have added positions from the Adams-Fr. Mission Church to allow their representatives to learn the knowledge and responsibilities of Church organization and to better understand what is needed to help our Church grow and function. Ron Pfaff, President

EXPLANATIONS FOR BEING ABOVE BIDS

HAMM'S = + 173.30 = Removed 3 evergreen trees from entrance corner, removed sod that was higher than blacktop, Dug deeper around sewer cleanout pipe to add larger breaker rock to pack better to take care of soft spot seepage around that cleanout pipe which was under the blacktop.

GASSER'S BLACKTOP = + 2,804.25 = Extra blacktop added because of widening entrance driveway and making a rounded curve to enter parking area, plus extra blacktop widened to make entrance to dumpster smoother.

CUSTOM CONCRETE & MASONRY = + 1,230.00 = Concrete slab widened by 2 feet to get further away from canopy pillars and breaker rock added under gravel base to attempt to get away from moisture under it to make cement last longer.

FAHNER ASPHALT STRIPING = +??? = Could be a little higher than bid because we asked them to add yellow paint to lower handicap access at sidewalk at front doors and added 3 arrows for better traffic flow indicators.

GRAY ELECTRIC = +1,000.00 = Never figured ahead that we would need their prompt services at the 4 light poles until digging down determined that some conduit with live wires inside had cracked loose from pole bases and needed to be replaced along with wires restrung and re-attached. Digging and adding breaker rock and gravel around the poles was delayed for a shorter period of time with their promptness. A larger new piece of conduit was delivered and put back in place that was found underground to be used in case a new added pole is ever added.

Community Sharing Pantry Information November 2023

Serving families in the Mauston/Lyndon Station School District What we are doing and where you can help

Starting 40 years ago, through 2019, we were serving families a complete balanced choice of food that was to last 3 to 5 days. COVID caused us to change to 2 weeks of food at a time. We had lower numbers of families served during COVID as they were receiving extra food stamp assistance. Our families do not come if they don't need help. Now that the extra part of food stamps is done and the cost of groceries continues to rise, we decided to still do two weeks of food per family. Below is a sample of our increase of products distributed:

Sept. 2022, we served -- 113 Households -- 39 children 82 seniors 111 Adults 232 total people served Sept. 2023, we served -- 190 Households -- 122 children 106 Seniors 240 Adults 462 total people served By December 2023 these numbers will probably be over 250 households each month

Comparison of some items distributed each month 2022 -first number- to now 2023:

Fresh Fruit/potatoes 565# each, now 950# ------ Canned Veggies 1137 cans, now 2005

Peanut butter 128 jars, now 235 ----- Canned Fruit 426 cans, now 736 ------ Soup 241 cans, now 421

Juice 113, Now 190 ----- Fresh Eggs 241 dozen, now 421 ----- Frozen meat 1,384#, now 2,470#

We use your cash donations to purchase the above items if they are not donated. We also are able to purchase items through Second Harvest Foodbank at lower or no cost.

Families that do receive food stamp assistance are not allowed to use their food stamps to purchase personal health care items such as shampoo, deodorant, toothpaste, toilet paper, etc. They also are not able to purchase cleaning items such as dish soap, laundry soap, cleaners, etc. We do try to have at least one of these items available each month. If you travel and have unopened sample/travel sizes – we can distribute them.

We are not able to accept home baked or home canned items. Garden produce, however, is gratefully accepted. If you are cleaning out your cupboards – we do watch dates. We don't distribute items that are over 1 year past the date.

We do have 2 walk-in coolers and 2 walk-in freezers. Any meat donations should be frozen and if it is fresh beef, pork, venison, etc. It must be processed through a licensed processor. One or two pound packages are the best.

Community food drives are a lifeline for us. We are totally funded by donations. We have no paid staff. All our volunteers donate their time to serve our fellow families in need. Thank you for assisting us in our mission.
