

Ministry is always in the picture at Luther Prep. During the fall, we have several special events which help our students focus on ministry.

MINISTRY DAY

Instead of normal classes, all our students spend a day learning about different kinds of gospel ministry. We welcome two dozen pastors, teachers. and church members who share perspectives and insights from their ministries. Students hear about life as a full-time Gospel proclaimer and learn about different forms ministry can take. Ministry Day informs, excites, and motivates students to find THEIR ministry.

TASTE OF MINISTRY

Our 12th grade students get to spend 2 days "on the job" with a pastor or teacher. They observe the pastor or teacher at work, ask questions, and help out in various ways. Boys shadowing a pastor might read Scripture lessons in a church service, visit members, help with outreach calls, or assist with catechism class. Boys and girls shadowing a teacher might give a spelling quiz, play with students at recess, do read aloud time, and help children with their homework. Taste of Ministry is a great way to see yourself as a pastor or teacher.

TRIP TO MLC

Our 11th grade students get to visit Martin Luther College, where our pastors and teachers are trained. They learn about the college, get a taste of campus life, and ask guestions about college life and ministry training. They also have a LOT of fun on campus, in the hotel, and on the coach bus. Visiting MLC is a highlight for our juniors!

WHAT IS THIS & WHY?

HSPT stands for High School Placement Test. It's a standardized test used to gauge a student's academic abilities, Luther Prep administers the HSPT as part of our enrollment process, and the test results help us place students in appropriate classes.

Luther Prep offers the HSPT on campus three times. This year's on campus test dates are November 11th, January 13th, and April 13th. If you're interested in attending LPS, sign up for one of those test dates by emailing info@lps.wels.net.

If students live more than 75 miles from LPS, we'll arrange for a teacher to proctor the test at their school.
