Pastor's Corner

Matthew 10:17-20 – ***Be on guard against people. They will hand you over to councils, and they will whip you in their synagogues. ¹⁸ You will be brought into the presence of governors and kings for my sake, as a testimony to them and to the Gentiles. ¹⁹ Whenever they hand you over, do not be worried about how you will respond or what you will say, because what you say will be given to you in that hour. ²⁰ In fact you will not be the ones speaking, but the Spirit of your Father will be speaking through you.***

“It is by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, whom you crucified but whom God raised from the dead....Salvation is found in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given to men by which we must be saved. When they saw the courage of Peter and John and realized that they were unschooled, ordinary me, they were astonished and they took note that these men had been with Jesus.” (Acts 4) Yes, the Holy Spirit gave them words didn't He? Peter and John knew exactly what to say as they stood before the ruling Sanhedrin.

“So then, King Agrippa....I have had God's help to this very day, and so I stand here and testify to small and great alike. I am saying nothing beyond what the prophets and Moses would have said—that the Christ would suffer and, as the first to rise from the dead, would proclaim light to his own people and to the Gentiles.” (Acts 27) Again the Holy Spirit gave Paul the words to say as he stood on trial for his life before the king. He was not ashamed of the gospel.

“My conscience is captive to the Word of God. I cannot recant anything, unless I am proved wrong according to the Scripture. For to go against conscience is neither right nor safe. Here I stand. I cannot do otherwise. God help me. Amen!” Yes, God gave Martin Luther the courage to speak these words as he stood on trial at the Diet of Worms.

What trials are you facing? Do you have people opposing you? Do you have people asking you questions? We know that we also have the words we need, right? We have words which also come from the Holy Spirit. All of the Bible is God-breathed. What will you say? God has given us the words, hasn't He? We have the words of eternal life. We have words that speak of Jesus – His life – His cross – His death – His victory over the grave.

The world will keep challenging and attacking us. The devil is still working to deceive and devour us. So take comfort once again as Jesus says: ***“do not be worried about how you will respond or what you will say, because what you say will be given to you in that hour. In fact you will not be the ones speaking, but the Spirit of your Father will be speaking through you.”*** We have the very words of God. I pray the Holy Spirit keep giving us the strength and courage to speak them.

DONATIONS FOR NEW MAUSTON PARKING NEEDED

Donations are being asked from anyone who would like to assist the Wish List to complete our New, badly needed, Mauston Church Parking Lot Replacement Project. The Mauston Parking Lot is scheduled to be totally redone this summer during either July or August. Besides a new underneath base and new blacktop, it includes repairing part of the cement sidewalk curbing for safety reasons, plus making the incline cement area outside the Main Doors wider, as well as replacing part of the damaged Cement under the canopy.

In the summer of 2017, we refurbished the Parking Lot, which was expected to last 5-7 years before it needed to be replaced. We are now starting the 6th year. We originally thought we had enough donated funds to cover the full cost. However, when bids came in, the cost is a lot more than we expected. As you have probably seen listed in the Bulletins, the full cost will be approximately \$247,000.00. We started out with 201,000.00 available for the project. Through Sunday, July 23, 2023, we have received additional donations which now gives us \$223,695.00 available. This means we are approximately \$23,305.00 short. The Voter's at the April Quarterly Meeting made the Parking Lot our top priority. The Voter's did approve the bids from Gasser Construction for the Black Top work, from Hamm's Construction for the preliminary grading, breaker rock, and gravel base, and from Custom Concrete & Masonry for the cement work.

After previously having approved the spending of donated funds to put up a new Digital Sign, that motion was amended to put that project on hold for now and move those funds to the parking lot project. We would sincerely appreciate and thank anyone in advance if you could help by donating to the completion of this much needed project. A Thank You also goes out to any Members who have already donated to this project. (Ron Pfaff, President, St. Paul's)

2nd UPDATE MAUSTON PARKING LOT RE-CONSTRUCTION

This is the 2nd update on the progress and future work plans time frame of the re-construction being done to the Mauston Church Parking Lot. Hamm Bros. prep and pre-blacktop work = The Hamm's crew moved equipment in and started tearing up the old construction of the approx. 47,000 square foot parking lot area on Thursday, Sept. 07. They began peeling off old blacktop that is hauled away, salvaged as much as possible of the approx. 8 inches of gravel base to stockpile and reuse on our lot, and undercut dug and hauled away subsoil. A construction fabric, which is an aid to stopping moisture from rising upward, is placed on the ground below the 12 inch base layer of new breaker rock that is crushed and hauled in (This had not been used in the 1st construction process). After putting down the breaker rock, it is leveled by use of a GPS monitored blade that assists perfect leveling and then is rolled and compacted and packed with use of a vibratory roller, Then salvaged, used gravel is added first and leveled and compacted, followed by adding the new gravel and then leveling and compacting that for a total of an 8 inch layer of gravel added above the breaker rock. Hamm's also dug out and added 12 inches of breaker rock and 8 inches of gravel to the spot under the Canopy that is being re-cemented. Hopefully, the addition of breaker rock will add to the life of this cement.

Hamm's Bros. finished their portion of the prep work on Wednesday, Sept. 20th, having worked a total of 7 1/3 days. They finished up by taking off and leveling some of the sod next to the blacktop, as over the years it got too high and did not allow drainage off the blacktop. They also dug out the sod and reshaped the lawn area on the south end of the parking lot next to Grayside Ave., so that water can now drain toward the ditch and drain that goes under Grayside Ave. Previously, that area of lawn was uneven and did not allow drainage to that road drain and usually remained wet after a rain.

Hamm's also removed the 3 evergreen trees that had been next to the driveway entrance/exit, so that the driveway is a little wider and visibility is better. Also, rather than a 90 degree turn into the parking lot, with the trees gone, a curved corner was made for easier flow when entering.

Dean Schulte, along with 3 assistants formed up the new section of concrete pad under the Canopy on Thursday, Sept. 14 and poured the 5 inch depth of cement delivered from Croell Concrete on Tuesday, Sept. 19th. New concrete cannot be driven on for 5-7 days.

Gasser Blacktop Construction's Crew started on Thursday afternoon, Sept. 21, as their 3 man crew began fine grading with use of their GPS monitored motor patrol blade and a box spreader with blade machine. They added some gravel as needed to get the leveling process as perfect as possible. A water truck spread many gallons of water a number of times during this process to aid in the packing of the gravel surface. They also rolled and packed the gravel by use of a vibratory roller at

least 3 times, as they make sure the surface is compacted, level, and ready to be paved. This work continued through late afternoon Friday, Sept. 22. We were able to use the compacted parking lot for a Wedding on Saturday, Sept. 23 and for Church services on Sunday, Sept. 24. On Monday morning, Sept. 25, this same crew plans to fine grade a little if need be and then again check to make sure the surface is all prepped correctly for the 1st phase of blacktop being applied. Sometime during the day on Monday, Sept. 25, the blacktopping crew will arrive at our lot after completing another job. On Monday, they plan to complete the first layer of 1¾ inches of blacktop. On Tuesday, Sept. 26, Gasser's will not be working at our lot. On Wednesday, Sept. 27, the blacktopping crew will return to finish the 1st layer if they did not complete it yet, and then put down the final 2nd layer of 1¾ inches, for a 2 layer total of 3 ½ inches to complete the job.

Weather permitting the above is Gasser's plan. If we get stormy weather so that it is too wet to lay blacktop, then an adjustment will need to be made. Fahrner Asphalt, as soon as the blacktopping is completed, will be here on Thursday, Sept. 28, to work out the parking grid and then they will be re-striping the entire parking lot spaces using yellow traffic paint the same day. While Fahrner is striping the Parking Lot, we cannot drive on it while they are working because the paint will be fresh and needs a short time to dry. However, once they are finished, then it can be used. Any other updates to a waiting period will be announced.

Again, whenever a crew is not working and the Parking Lot is still just rolled gravel, it can be used by us for parking. When Gasser has completed the 1st layer of black top and/or the 2nd layer, we will be able to immediately use the lot at the end of each day as they finish. There is no waiting period of time before use.
