Pastor's Corner

³And from the throne I heard a loud voice that said, "Look! God's dwelling is with people. He will dwell with them, and they will be his people. God himself will be with them, and he will be their God. ⁴He will wipe away every tear from their eyes. There will be no more death or sorrow or crying or pain, because the former things have passed away." – Rev 21:3,4

"I'm just so tired of being tired." "When will the pain end?" "When is *all of this* going to end?"

Maybe you've heard this "Would You Rather?" question: "Would you rather have to fight off 100 duck-sized horses, or 1 horse-sized duck?" I think we talk quite a bit about fighting the horse-sized ducks of life when they come waddling towards us (grief, heartbreak, job loss, etc.). Those kinds of hardships naturally come to mind when you think of major problems in life. Yes, they are awful and intimidating. Yes, they do knock you off your feet and leave you feeling breathless. However, they will not haunt you forever. There will be a time when none of those things exist, when they are the farthest thing on your mind. The joy of heaven is knowing that all of the things that have plagued you here will be driven out completely by your almighty Savior. The former things have passed away. The old has gone, the new has come.

This passage also brings us comfort and encouragement when it comes to the "duck-sized horses," little problems that often aren't included in the same conversation as the big ones. Those little problems seem to bother us more frequently, and don't seem to let up. 100 duck-sized horses can wear you down just as much as one

horse-sized duck. "I wake up every morning and my feet are sore, my joints ache. And all of it is just a reminder that I'm getting older." "My husband doesn't listen to me, and every conversation I have with my kid turns into a fight." "It just feels like I'm running into disappointment after disappointment. When's it going to be my turn to be happy?" That kind of struggle isn't as visible to others, and maybe you feel like talking about it makes you seem like a Debbie Downer. Your Savior knows about those too. Even those things - the little frustrations, and worries, and disappointments – will be lifted off of your shoulders in Heaven and discarded, never to bother you again.

Maybe you're thinking, "Yeah that's great, but how does that help me now?" The comfort isn't just coming to you in the future. You have comfort, relief, and strength right here and right now, from your Savior, who says to you, "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest." Through the big things and the small, you have support from your brothers and sisters, who are there to pray for you and encourage you, and most importantly, you have support from your Savior and His Word. Keep your eyes heavenward, to the everlasting glories and joys won for you by Jesus.

"Be still, my soul; the hour is hast'ning on when we shall be forever with the Lord, when disappointment, grief and fear are gone, sorrow forgot, love's purest joys restored. Be still, my soul; when change and tears are past, all safe and blessed we shall meet at last."

DONATIONS FOR NEW MAUSTON PARKING NEEDED Donations are being asked from anyone who would like to assist the Wish List to complete our New, badly needed, Mauston Church Parking Lot Replacement Project. The Mauston Parking Lot is scheduled to be totally redone this summer during either July or August. Besides a new underneath base and new blacktop, it includes repairing part of the cement sidewalk curbing for safety reasons, plus making the incline cement area outside the Main Doors wider, as well as replacing part of the damaged Cement under the canopy.

In the summer of 2017, we refurbished the Parking Lot, which was expected to last 5-7 years before it needed to be replaced. We are now starting the 6th year. We originally thought we had enough donated funds to cover the full cost. However, when bids came in, the cost is a lot more than we expected. As you have probably seen listed in the Bulletins, the full cost will be approximately \$247,000.00. We started out with 201,000.00 available for the project. Through Sunday, July 23, 2023, we have received additional donations which now gives us \$211,580.00 available. This means we are approximately \$35,420.00 short. The Voter's at the April Quarterly Meeting made the Parking Lot our top priority. The Voter's did approve the bids from Gasser Construction for the Black Top work, from Hamm's Construction for the preliminary grading, breaker rock, and gravel base, and from Custom Concrete & amp; Masonry for the cement work.

After previously having approved the spending of donated funds to put up a new Digital Sign, that motion was amended to put that project on hold for now and move those funds to the parking lot project. We would sincerely appreciate and thank anyone in advance if you could help by donating to the completion of this much needed project. A Thank You also goes out to any Members who have already donated to this project. (Ron Pfaff, President, St. Paul's)

Hamm Brothers Excavating is scheduled to be on site the week of September 11 to dig up the existing parking lot and put down a new solid base. D L Gasser is scheduled to be onsite starting the week of September 18 to do the fine grading / sloping. Once that is completed, the paving will be done. Some wrap up work will be done the following week of September 25. More updates will be coming to let you know if changes occur. We can also give you better instructions on how this will affect parking, access to church, etc. Thank you for all the contributions made so far and those yet to come.
