John 20:27-29 - Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and look at my hands. Take your hand and put it into my side. Do not continue to doubt, but believe." Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Because you have seen me, you have believed. Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believe."

A boy went to the doctor because he had a pain in his foot. The doctor discovered that the boy had a tooth growing in the bottom of his foot. Can you believe that? Or would have to see it to believe it?

You may be surprised to know that a man by the name of James Cook once had a chicken that laid a perfectly square egg. I have seen white eggs, brown eggs, even spotted eggs, but I have never seen a square egg. Perhaps this something you would have to see to believe.

There are many things that make someone doubt. But what is dangerous is when we begin to doubt God. Indeed, God has done many thing things that seen unbelievable and far too good to be true. On the top of the list is what Jesus did on Easter.

For Thomas the fact that Jesus was alive again seemed something too unbelievable, something he had to see to believe. Thomas gets labeled as the doubter, but none of Jesus' disciples were any better. This includes us. The devil keeps whispering lies such as God doesn't care or God won't forgive. Doubt creeps in. Trouble and suffering cause us to fear and to worry. Doubt digs in again.

Thankfully, we have a Savior who comes again and again to remove all doubt. Jesus says look at my hands – hands driven through with nails to I could be pinned to a cross to pay for all your sins. Jesus says look at my side - a side that was pierced for you so now you can know that I will always be by your side and one day I will bring you to live side by side with me and all believers in paradise. With every promise God keeps for you, and He keeps every one, He says: "*Do not continue to doubt, but believe.*" How blessed we are to have a Savior who rose from the dead as He promised He would. <u>CALL MADE TO REV. JONATHAN J. KOLANDER</u>: Our 2nd Call Meeting to fill the Pastor vacancy created when Pastor Sellnow accepted a call to Grace Lutheran in Glendale, Arizona, was held on Sunday afternoon, March 10, 2024. Voter's selected Rev. Jonathan J. Kolander to be called to fill our Vacancy at the Adams-Friendship Campus Church.

Pastor Kolander, who is 58 years old, was born and raised in Montello, WI. His wife Jennifer (nee Landvatter) was born and raised in Oconomowoc, WI. She has a Business Degree from Wisconsin Lutheran College in Milwaukee and has an occupation as an Accountant. Together, they raised four (4) children and two (2) of them reside in and work in Wisconsin, as one is a Nurse in Milwaukee and the other is an Interior Designer in southeastern Wisconsin. Pastor referred

to his wife as a "True Milwaukee Brewers Baseball Fan", as she rarely misses watching a game. He said they both are still fans of not only the Brewers, but also all the sports teams in Wisconsin.

Pastor and his wife now reside in Orangevale, California, which is near Sacramento, where he has served for the past 6 ¹/₂ years since 09/01/2017 as the only Pastor at St. Mark's Lutheran Church in Citrus, Heights, Cal. This is a congregation of 368 members with 317 communicant members. St. Mark's also has a K-8 Lutheran School with approx. 76 students and 6 teachers.

On May 31, 1987, Pastor graduated from Northwestern College in Watertown, WI. with a Bachelor of Arts degree. He then attended and graduated from Wisconsin Lutheran Seminary in Mequon, WI. with a Master of Divinity. He also served as a Vicar at St. Lucas Lutheran Church in Kewaskum, WI. Pastor Kolander has served as a Pastor for a total of 32 years/8 months. His 1st Pastoral position was in a Dual Parish starting on 07/14/1991, for 4 years/4 months at Hope Lutheran in Indian River, MI. and Our Savior in Gaylord, MI. Then starting on Nov. 16, 1995, Pastor served for 21 years/9 ½ months as a Multi-Site Pastor at Bethlehem Lutheran in Menomonee Falls, WI. and at Bethlehem Lutheran in Germantown, WI., before he moved to California in 2017.

His other service experiences include serving on the Board of Directors for the WELS Foundation, Inc.: serving as Chairman for the Ariz,/Calif. Mission Board; serving as a member of the Board for Home Missions; serving as a member of the Martin Luther College Governing Board; serving as the Chairman for the Ministry of Christian Giving (SEW); he served as the 2nd Vice President for Southeastern Wisc. from 2012-2017); he presently is also serving as a member of the MCG Review Committee; and he has been serving as a Campus Ministry Pastor since 2017.

Pastor Kolander, in his self-assessment evaluation, indicated he has a heart for and feels very innovative for preaching, visiting hospital patients and doing shut-in visits, and doing general administration tasks. He truly enjoys being an associate Pastor, counseling, being a leader, doing outreach activities, working with youth, home missions, and doing Bible classes for both Adults and Youth.

I very much enjoyed my friendly and fun conversation with Pastor Kolander. He has a very friendly, outgoing personality. I feel he would fit our needs as one of our three associate Pastors. <u>CHRISTIAN EDUCATION</u> – "Train up a child in the way he should go: and when he is old, he will not depart from it" (Proverbs 22:6)

Are you looking for Christian education opportunities? We have several options to offer for your consideration. When a baby is baptized, the church sends to the parents' cradle roll materials so even the youngest are hearing about Jesus. For newborn and very young children, we have libraries where books are available to read to them. They are very welcome to be at our church services as they start to learn at this age. Remember, they will be the ones that make up our congregation in the future. The sound of children at a church is a good indication of future growth for your congregation.

As the children get to the pre-school and elementary school age, there are available Sunday School classes, VBS (Vacation Bible School) sessions, JAM (Jesus in the Afternoon for Me) sessions, church youth group activities, catechism classes, and WELS educational school facilities. In Mauston, we have our Lil Lambs Christian daycare. For 3K, 4K, K, and grades 1-8 training, there are local WELS schools located in Wonewoc, Baraboo, and Wis. Rapids. Our own congregation is currently investigating the possibility of adding an educational facility in Mauston. In the elementary grades, our congregation covers a vast majority of the costs of education through our general budget.

For post-elementary Christian education, WELS has high schools, colleges, and a seminary for your further training / learning. In this area, our congregation does offer some scholarships to assist financially. After our formal education has been completed, we have available BIC (Bible Information Class), several ongoing Bible classes, weekly church services, and many volunteer & amp; fellowship opportunities to be involved with. We can be teachers of the Word, spreading God's Word to people who do not know their Savior, visit shut-ins, etc.

As parents, we have the primary responsibility of bringing up our children. As individuals or families, we are also the primary ones responsible for growing in our faith. Our church and its resources can be a great asset for assistance. Stay close to our Savior, worship regularly, partake in the sacraments, continue to learn in the Word, pray, and give praise to our Lord. Heaven is our goal! God's blessings! Bob Storandt, elder
