### It's all about Jesus.

As for me, brothers, when I came to you, I did not come with superior speech or wisdom in order to proclaim to you the testimony of God. For I had no intention of knowing anything among you except Jesus Christ, and him crucified. (1 Corinthians 2:1-2)

One of the great joys of being a pastor is getting to point people to someone far better than yourself when faced with the challenges of life. Many jobs have as their goal customer service. And often times there can be a lot of pressure to make sure you have satisfied customers in such jobs. Being a pastor is a bit different. Yes, we care about the people we serve. Yes, we strive to do our job well and offer service that is a benefit to those in the church. But at the end of the day we can offer nothing on our own that can address the problems people face. We cannot change hearts, we cannot fix relationships, we cannot alter behavior, make you healthy, rich, or prosperous.

But we can do something far better. We can give you Jesus.

When St. Paul wrote the words (above) to the Christians in Corinth he was writing to people for whom he cared deeply. He had labored among them, prayed for them, preached to them, and now was writing to address them in their time of need. But what words could he speak, what wisdom could he offer, what did he know that could make any difference in their lives? Just one thing. One person. "I had no intention of knowing anything among you except Jesus Christ, and him crucified."

Your pastors today repeat these words to you. At the end of the day we only want to make known the gospel of Jesus crucified for sinners! This is the message that has changed our future, and yours. This is the message that gives us hope no matter how hopeless this life often seems. This is the message that brings peace to a troubled conscience, courage to a fearful heart, and hope in the face of life's great challenges and death's dark valley.

We have a Savior. Jesus Christ the crucified. We have a Savior who bled and died for us. A Savior who rose in victory. A Savior who rules in majesty. A Savior who will bring us all to glory. There is no message that could be better than that. There is nothing worth knowing if we don't know that. And there is no ministry worth sharing in if it does not have at it's very core Jesus Christ and the message of him crucified for us.

This coming year will bring changes to our ministry at St. Paul's. The Savior's cross remains the same. May the message you've heard from pastors old and new always remind you of the great Shepherd and Overseer of our souls and magnify his love and mercy in your eyes of faith – a faith that clings to nothing but Jesus Christ, and him crucified!

The Men's Lutheran Fellowship Club met for the 2nd time on Thursday night November 16th at 6:30 pm in the Fellowship Hall at St Paul's in Mauston. Snacks were provided. We had a devotion to start the evening then played 3 games of dart ball which was a lot of fun and hopefully dart ball skills will improve. Attendance was down mainly due to illness. Hopefully word of this Fellowship friendly and fun dart ball competition gets out so more can take part. May God Bless all of our Fellowship activities.

#### Financial / Ministry Plan Mauston- Bob Storandt

**Committee report** The school bus has been sold back to Nelson Bus Service for \$10,000.00. Money will be put into a CD for future transportation considerations. Mauston parking lot reconstruction and paving is completed, and bills paid. Some work needed in the Spring to fill in the areas between the asphalt and lawn. More details are noted in other articles.

Ministry plan financials summary – November 2023:

Lil Lambs Daycare – Basically a normal month we have been seeing recently. Their total equity is at \$112,808.13 as of the end of November 2023.

On the profit & loss sheet, the normal November operating expenses resulted in a net loss of \$2,877.83. However, they received \$15,370.09 in grants/other income and only used \$5,267.00 of it, which resulted in an additional extra income of \$10,103.09. This then gave the daycare a net positive monthly value of \$7,225.16. For the year (after 11 months), their net income sits at a positive amount of \$27,662.13.

Church (Mauston & Adams) - The November blessings received were under what we had planned for at \$21,778.76. This is even after we received a single donation of \$10,000.00. We were, however, able to keep our responsibilities under budget by \$8,150.99 which resulted in a monthly financial shortage of \$5,249.81 (actual). From a YTD standpoint we are experiencing a shortfall of \$70,286.29 in normal budgeted income accounts and a shortfall in responsibilities / expense budgeted accounts of \$16,757.71 which has resulted in an overall shortfall of \$24,421.71 (actual). Please remember I am comparing how we are doing in actual amounts to what we had planned in the 2023 operating budget.

Here are some extra pieces of information on the financials and overall thoughts –

I was a little concerned about the shortfall on our budgeted financials, HOWEVER we need to also remember that we have been blessed with extra giving toward the special projects in Mauston and Adams of over \$44,000.00. God is watching over us!

My personal observation is that church attendance (particularly in Mauston) has been down in the past few weeks. Normally this holiday season is when more people attend. Let's see what December brings.

A couple of account explanations on the monthly report

Acct 4106 – Randy will be donating his time at church most likely for the months of Nov-Feb for personal income reasons.

Acct 4303 – Adams electricity is billed quarterly vs Mauston's is billed monthly.

A couple of YTD and other explanations

Acct 4274 – QuickBooks payroll had an issue for a bit with forgetting to take out some taxes. That problem is fixed, and our accounts are being updated, which caused this extra expense.

The \$10,000 for the bus sale was finalized in December and the CD will be shown in next month's reports.

BTU has finally completed the heating and A/C units in the house the Wilke family purchased at a cost of \$11,942.00. The money for this expense was set aside at the time of the sale and has been paid out of that set aside. The cost will not hit our normal church financials. We found out that the Fahrner cost for striping the new Mauston parking lot was paid for in the invoice from D L Gasser
