Pastor's Corner

Matthew 2:1-2, 11 – After Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, when Herod was king, Wise Men from the east came to Jerusalem. They asked, "Where is he who has been born King of the Jews? We saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him."... After they went into the house and saw the child with Mary, his mother, they bowed down and worshipped him. Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts: gold, frankincense, and myrrh.

Epiphany is January 6 and it is the day often referred to as Gentiles Christmas. On this twelfth day of Christmas something wonderful is revealed to us. Jesus is revealed as not just the King of the Jews. Jesus came to be the Savior not just for the people of Israel. Jesus came to be the Savior and King of all nations. What an epiphany! Jesus came to save you from your sin. Jesus came to rule in your heart through faith and give you a kingdom that will have no end.

This is the truth we see when these Wise Men, these Magi, these Gentile foreigners come to worship Jesus. They lay expensive gifts at the feet of this newborn King because they recognize Jesus came for them. They worship and honor Jesus because they, by faith, knew Jesus came from God to save them from their sins. When you look at their journey to come to worship Jesus you have to marvel at their faith and determination. They had to travel a long distance. They didn't have cars to hop in and go either. They get lost. When they ask around in Jerusalem no one seems to even know about the birth of this Savior. When God's Word and the star guide them to the right place what they see is certainly not anything that looks like the birth of a new king. Instead, they come to a poor hut with a poor young woman and a poor little child. Despite all this: "They bowed down and worshipped him. Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts: gold, frankincense, and myrrh."

, Why wouldn't we do the same? What obstacles get in the way of our coming to see Jesus? I pray the Lord gives us the same faith to knock them all down so we too come regularly to worship Him. There is no gift that parents placed under the tree that is better than the gift they give their children when they bring them to church to see Jesus. There is no place more important to be or more valuable use of time spent together than to be where Jesus promises in His Word to be with us. Worship Him! Especially, now since we know exactly how Jesus saved us! He poured out His innocent precious blood on a cross and willingly laid down His life in our place. He died and came back again from death to rescue us. Yes, Jesus is our Savior and King. Knowing this in 2024 we will want to join with the Magi and come to worship Him.

All members from Mauston and Adams-Friendship are encouraged to attend, as we are all one congregation, with two locations. We value and appreciate our Member Involvement in Church decisions, as well as we encourage everyone's selfless service to Christ's Church and willingness in helping to spread God's Gospel to our family, friends, and community. It is very important that we all keep ourselves informed of the business of our Church and contribute to decisions that are made. Starting on Sunday, January 21st, you are encouraged to pick up the Voter's Meeting Agenda Packet, which can be found in the Narthex as you enter the Church.

Among the Agenda Items to be discussed, and/or approved include:

Everyone in the Congregation is invited and encouraged to attend a Voter's meeting, but this is a reminder that our Constitution and Bylaws state that eligible voting members are those male communicant members who have declared their agreement with the Constitution, who have been received by the voter's assembly of the congregation, who are at least 18 years of age, and who have attended at least one (1) voter's meeting in the previous calendar year, which means one (1) year previous to this present meeting.

PROPOSED NEW BYLAW AS ARTICLE #21

Article #21 – Intended Purpose of Maughs Creek Lots #58-#67 In Mauston, Wis.

In the 1950's, when Five (5) families of St. Paul's Evangelical Lutheran Church of Mauston, Wi. (WELS SYNOD) created the Church's Christian Education Fund with

their donated money to start and continue donations to this fund, it was their request that these donated funds and any other donations to this fund be used only towards Church related purposes, such as the purchase of property to build a new Church or a Lutheran Christian Parochial School. In 1969, with use of CEF Account funds, property was purchased in Mauston, officially known as Maughs Creek Sub-division lots #58, 59, 60, 61, 62, 63, 64, 65, 66, and #67. In 1995, the construction of a New Church with adjoining parking lot was completed and dedicated on this property now known as 517 Grayside Ave., Mauston, Wi. All of the above property lots were purchased for future Church or Lutheran Christian Education use only, as requested by the original donors, with the request that this property would never be sold off to anyone for any other use or purpose as separate lots in order to create a profit for the Church.

Note: This Recommended New By-Law Article #21 will be presented and discussed at the September 10th, 2023 Church Council Mtg., recommended for presentation and discussion for approval to the October 29th, 2023 Quarterly Voter's Meeting, and presented to the January 28th, 2024 Annual Voter's meeting for an actual vote of approval.

***Note: Any By-Law Addition or Change must be only presented and discussed at one Voter's Meeting and then approval can be asked for at the next Voter's Mtg.)
