"Though your sins are like scarlet, they will be as white as snow.

Though they are as red as crimson, they will be like wool."

Isaiah 1:18

For three summers in college, I worked on the MLC paint crew. We would go through the empty dorms and offices, touching up what needed to be done. As you can imagine, by the end of the summer, my work shirt, shorts, and shoes were covered top to bottom in paint splotches (photo for reference). There was no way any of those splotches were coming out in the wash, and every day I'd come back with a new stain I *could not* get out. Maybe you've had that frustrating experience too – your favorite shirt ruined by some of the hardest stains to get out (red wine, tomato sauce, coffee). Even when you go at it with a tide stick, or with some expensive detergent that promises to fight the toughest stains, that stain still sticks around.

Sometimes the sin we commit, whether it's big and small, can feel like a nasty stain. As much as you scrub and scrub to try and get rid of it yourself, there's always a faint reminder. You carry it with you wherever you go. It becomes the first thing you think about when you look in the mirror. Here God's Word describes sin as a dark red stain, not just on a tiny area that you could cover up with a jacket, but one that covered you completely. And it's not just on the surface, sin has been rooted deep down in us since the



beginning of our lives. There are certainly methods, home remedies, that people may try to get rid of sin – justifying it with a million excuses, rewriting the history of events to paint yourself in a better light, love-bombing those you've wronged with a pile of good deeds to cancel out the bad – but none of that works to completely blot out the stain.

Enter in: Jesus, the Lamb of God without *any spot or blemish*, the ultimate Stain Remover. This is his method for removing your stains completely – Step 1: He was "born of a woman, so that he would be born under the law, in order to redeem those under the law." (Galatians 4:4,5). He actively avoided all of the sinful slop that the devil, the world, and our sinful flesh have coated us with, perfectly obeying the will of the Father. Step 2: He suffered and died on your behalf, so that you could wash [your] robes and make them white in the blood of the Lamb (Revelation 7:14). Step 3: He rose on Easter Morning, and is coming again to transform our humble bodies to be like his glorious body (Philippians 3:21). His sacrifice means that you are washed clean of every last one of your sins, from crimson red to sparkling white. Take that to heart as you follow Jesus to the cross on Good Friday and see him rise on Easter Morning. He has redeemed you, forgiven you, and washed you clean!

"I lay my sins on Jesus, the spotless Lamb of God; he bears them all and frees us from the accursed load. I bring my guilt to Jesus to wash my crimson stains white in his blood most precious till not a spot remains." (CW 798:1)

#### SPECIAL VOTER'S 2ND CALL MEETING TO BE HELD IN MAUSTON CHURCH:

On Sunday Afternoon, March 10, 2024 at 1:00pm, at the St. Paul's Mauston Campus Church Fellowship Hall, our entire St. Paul's Congregation members from both Mauston and Adams-Friendship campuses are all invited to attend a Special Voter's 2nd Call Meeting.

We value and appreciate all of our Congregation Member involvement in Church decisions even if you are not an eligible Voter. We encourage selfless service to Christ's Church and your willingness to keep informed about the business of our Church.

At this Special Voter's 2nd Call meeting needed to fill the vacancy position left by Pastor Sellnow leaving to accept a call in Arizona, our Circuit Pastor Dave Karow will represent our Circuit President and will present us with a slate of Pastors that he recommends could fit our needs. We will be given a small history of each Pastor on the slate and then we will discuss and vote by secret written ballot on which one we should call.

Note: If you are an Eligible voter and have not attended a Voter's meeting in the past calendar year, but you did attend the Special Pre-Call Meeting on Jan. 14, 2024, or the 1st Call Meeting on Jan. 28, 2024, or the January 28, 2024 Annual Church Voter's Meeting, then you did make yourself eligible to vote at this 2nd Call meeting because these meetings were all considered Voter's Meetings. Attendance at this meeting will make you eligible to vote at future Voter's meetings over the next calendar year.

Reminder: Our Constitution and Bylaws state that eligible voting members are those Male Communicant Members who have declared their agreement with the Constitution, who are at least 18 years of age, and who have attended at least one (1) Voter's Meeting in the previous calendar year, which means one (1) year previous to this present meeting.
