Pastor's Corner

"For out of his fullness we have all received grace upon grace." - John 1:16

Maybe you've heard the phrase "Too much of a good thing." If you pile on too much of something, even if it's your favorite thing in the world, it begins to spoil your interest in it. I love a good boneless wing – but ask me how I feel about boneless wings after ordering 24 of them from Buffalo Wild Wings. I love the color green – but if everything I wore was green, if my whole house was painted green, you might mistake me for the Lucky Charms Leprechaun. Too much of a good thing could be a bad thing.

The devil and our sinful flesh may try hard to convince us to treat the ever-flowing fountain of God's grace as "too much of a good thing" - diminishing our interest in "the same message over and over again." You may even be tempted to think, "Why should I go to church? Why should I spend time in God's Word? I know the routine - I know I'm forgiven, I know Jesus loves me. I've got it." If we're not careful, the precious Gospel message can fade to gray, becoming mundane and monotonous. That's where the Law comes in, to humble us, to slap us awake, to make us appreciate even more what our Gracious Lord is giving to us in Jesus – completely undeserved, completely free. And when we are convinced by God's Law that we are sinners in desperate need of a Savior, when we feel the heat from the fires of hell and long for a touch of cool water on the tongue, the rush of Living Water bursts through the gates. Here John says that we have received grace upon grace, or grace in place of grace already given. Out of God's abundant mercy and love, he pours forth forgiveness from himself, gifted to us in Christ's perfect life, his innocent death, and his glorious resurrection. The Scriptures proclaim the richness of that forgiveness in Christ: "By the mercies of the Lord we are not consumed, for his compassions do not fail. They are new every morning. Great is your faithfulness." The list of blessings given to us by Jesus rolls in front of our eyes like a scroll: forgiveness, salvation, eternal life, peace, hope, joy, love, encouragement, a new identity, a new verdict, a reconciled relationship with God the Father, the washing of rebirth and renewal in Baptism, his own body and blood in the Lord's Supper, an open line of communication in prayer. And that's not even to mention the physical blessings we receive from him. Could there be too much of a good thing when it comes to God's grace? Too much of a good thing here is a beautiful thing. We cannot exhaust his supply of love and mercy. God's Grace-made-flesh, the Prince of Peace, is here to soothe your guilt-ridden conscience, to wipe away your tears, to dispel all worries and fears and doubts. "Give thanks to the LORD, for he is good, his mercy endures forever."

Food Pantry

The Food Pantry 2023 end-of-year stats are in. We served 493 different families, which contained 222 different seniors, 664 different adults, 359 different children- for a total of 1,245 different people served. We provided up to 14 days of food each month. 157 families only came once during the year and 24 families came each month. All the other families were spread out during the year. We distributed a total 238,691# of food during the year. This does not include the extra 8,000# of limes, cucumbers, pumpkins, and bananas we shared with the community from our 4 "extra" semis who graciously shared with us this year. We also distributed 563 senior boxes with 16,890# of additional food. Items that we need if you are out shopping: soups, canned fruit and canned veggies, canned protein like peanut butter, tuna, chicken. Your cash donations help us to purchase needed food. We would not be here to help those families in need without the generous help of our volunteers and donations. We have a wonderful group of people to work with!

Committee report

Our loan for the Adams church building is in the early stages of working on the five-year renegotiation process (we have had the loan for 4 years). Our present loan has a subordination grant agreement from our WELS CEF (Church Extension Fund) group in the amount of \$19,657.00. If we keep our loan with the Bank of Mauston and do not need to re-register our loan, we do not need to do anything more with this agreement. It will just remain in place. If our church loan needs to be re-registered, we need to have CEF re-issue the subordination grant agreement paperwork and CEF is willing to do that. The main item to remember is that our congregation owes CEF \$19,657.00. We do not need to make any payments on that unless something happens between now and the year 2040. If the Adams church remains with our congregation then in the year 2040, the grant agreement is completed and no money is owed. It does not matter whether the church loan is paid off or not. If something were to change (i.e. Adams church is sold or changes Synod affiliation or ??) then the money is due CEF at that time.

There was a question as to whether we needed to make any changes to protect the two holding ponds in Adams. Our church insurance company, Church Mutual, said nothing was required to be done. Their risk department also reviewed it and agreed nothing was required but did offer some suggestions if we chose to do something. The documents with this information has been given to Jim Cranfield for review and recommendation.



Scholarships – Bob Storandt


Committee report
